



#### A Tribute to Dr. E.C. Braqq

Dear Family and Friends of Dr. E.C. Bragg:

Soon after I became a Christian some forty plus years ago, I was introduced in a wonderful and miraculous way to Dr. E.C. Bragg. It was at that first meeting that Dr. Bragg challenged me to quit my job and come to Trinity College "by faith!" I had always thought that theologians were fuzzy-headed academicians far removed from the ruts and rigors of real life. Now I knew it! The audacity of this Bible College professor to challenge me this way! But I was hungry to study the deeper aspects of the Word of God and so, I accepted his challenge, believing he was led of the Spirit of God in his challenge, and enrolled in Trinity College, and sought to sit at the feet of this dear servant of God, Dr. E.C. Bragg. I have never been sorry!

What I discovered from Dr. Bragg's teaching and from his godly example changed my life! His teaching was not abstract, remote, dry dogma. Through his energy, humor, brilliance and his uncanny ability to translate difficult concepts into graspable truth, the Word of God came alive for me, and hundreds, yea thousands of students like me! His teaching lives on through the lives and ministries of thousands of missionaries, Pastors, and Christian workers literally around the world.

Yes, Dr. Bragg has left us. Yes, our loss, is heavens gain. But the memory of his ministry will never leave us. Because of his wealth of Bible knowledge, training and skills, his effectiveness is enhanced and lives on in the lives of his students and colleagues. A plethora of descriptive adjectives could be carefully given to describe the life and ministry and accomplishments, of Dr. E.C. Bragg. But, simply put his accomplishments are beyond calculable or appraisable value. The impact of his life cannot be measured by objective yardsticks and impressive awards or verbal kudos. In fact, if we could hear him at this moment, he'd probably shout out what he had written on my Pauline Theology paper which he had graded with a 99. Beside the 99 grade score were the words . . . "nobody's perfect!" He had an uncanny and humorous way of prodding one on to excellence.

DR. BRAGG EULOGY

My life is richer and fuller because of Dr. Bragg's teaching. What an honor to sit at his feet and learn Pauline Theology, Eschatology, Systematic Theology, Bible Doctrine, Christian Psychology and many other subjects he was so skilled in teaching. He made no apologies for his textbook being the infallible Word of God. The Bible was paramount in his life and teaching.

With his razor sharp-mind he would cut through muddy thinking, expose kinks in logic, and encourage those he trained and taught to think straight. He had an amazing ability to keep his teaching skills honed to a sharp edge. His teaching and life was Spirit-filled. Those Spirit anointed cutting-edge skills and character created in the lives of his students a Spirit filled attitude and servant mentality to minister in today's world.

Dr. Bragg taught us sternly to live what we preach and preach what we live. He taught us that what we do in life is not nearly as important as what we are. That being is much deeper than doing for it relates to character, who we are, and how we make a life. He taught us that life also has to do with intangibles, the kind of people we become down inside, much of which cannot be measured by the plaudits of men. He challenged us to be men and women of conviction and integrity. He constantly reminded us that Christianity is more than just a creed to be believed, it is a life to be lived. His life transmitted in a deep and positive way that the Christ life was not only a path to spiritual enjoyment, it was also the Calvary road.

I would do my fellow servant dishonor if I did not mention in this eulogy the wife and family of Dr. E.C. Bragg, for Dr. Bragg loved his family. Their unselfish willingness to share their husband and father is a testimony and a challenge to those who would try and thwart the will and calling of God upon a life. Join with me today in saying "thank you" to Sister Pauline and the children for all of their sacrifice and courage, releasing their husband and father, for the work of the ministry. Sister Pauline's vital and effective behind the scenes ministry has touched us each one, for which we give praise to our wonderful Lord.



How can you even begin to express adequately the feelings that have been built in a lifetime of ministry in my life, for it was a ministry and a total one at that? There's a depth of love and gratitude that can never be told; it can only be felt by the heart.

There's a thank you for the most valuable part of my upbringing, a Christian home. Though I may not have appreciated it during the time that I was a part of it, an outside mature look back has taught me the tremendous worth that you brought to my life by providing me with a home based on Jesus Christ. 
